4th Grade	
Bible	Chapel
We study the basic doctrines of Christianity, such as the Trinity, salvation, sin nature, and eternity. We have a weekly test and/or memory verse quiz.	1st - 5th graders worship weekly in Chapel. Chapel is a corporate time for students to be encouraged and challenged as they grow in their understanding of God's purpose for their life.
Interactive Classroom	Accelerated Reader
FCS utilizes Mimio technology in our classrooms. This allows for more student engagement in whole group teaching. We also use Chromebooks for students to take learning to the next level via online learning, applications, and Google Classroom.	This is an incentive-based program which allows students to read books at their current reading level. They will then take a quiz on the computer to earn points for the books they read. Each quarter they will be given a points goal. Students who reach their goal will enjoy a special celebration at the end of the quarter.
English	Science
Writing & Grammar reviews and broadens 4th grade students' foundational knowledge of English conventions, and teaches students how to apply them directly to how they write and speak. Students will find six larger writing assignments for direct application of the writing process and grammar skills, as well as regular practice opportunities in journaling and other practice lessons. Students will also learn about the 6 Traits of Writing and how to directly apply them to their work, all while including Biblical worldview themes that will increase the students' sense of wonder at God's gift of language.	Students learn about life through the context of a Biblical worldview. We study living things, and the Earth's waters by using their scientific knowledge, inquiry skills, and engineering skills. This course also explores plants, invertebrates, oceans, and natural resources, and further analyzes their cycles and patterns. Students will discover more of the world around them and deepen their knowledge of the Creator.
Reading	Social Studies
Students will read a variety of genres while focusing on the literary elements, building comprehension skills and vocabulary. Students develop Biblical discernment through teacher-guided instruction, and comprehension through strategies, questions, and activities before, during and after reading.	Students will learn about the geography of the regions of the United States and its National Parks. This course also teaches students to assess the impact of the Christian faith on American culture, and form a Biblical worldview on the topics of environment, citizenship, and economics.
