Subject: Asbestos Containing Building Materials (ACBM) in Schools 40 CFR Part 736 Subpart E

Purpose: to Protect Human Health and the Environment from Air-Borne Asbestos Fibers

Objective: To inform parents, guardians, teachers and all FCS employees of compliance with 40 CFR part 763.93 (e) (10) Dated October 30, 1987

The AHERA inspection for our school system was conducted on June 6, 1988 and re-inspected in April 1991 & April 1994, to ascertain presence of asbestos-containing building materials. Samples of suspect building materials were taken by an accredited inspector and analyzed by an accredited laboratory using various approved methods to determine asbestos content.

The old elementary school building, church, and gym all appear to contain no friable (comes off with finger pressure) asbestos-containing building materials. However, the samples do reveal non-friable asbestos vinyl floor in certain areas of the school, church and gym.

Many schools across the state do contain asbestos vinyl floor products. When properly managed, there should be no fiber-release of asbestos materials from vinyl floor.
